Warren's Gating Project: On July, 17th, FSS installed a new gate at Warren's Cave; RCG members, Phil and Bill, assisted FSS with the project. Phil reported that it went well. Thanks to FSS and all who helped install the new gate!

NSS CORNER

NSS Webinars-Moon Diver: Descent into the Ancient Lavas of the Moon, Presented by: Dr. Laura Kerber: In 2009, several deep volcanic collapse pits were discovered on the Moon by the Japanese spacecraft SELENE. The Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter Camera subsequently captured high resolution oblique images of the pits, revealing that some of them opened into subterranean caverns, and that the walls of the pits exposed up to 40 meters of pristine lava stratigraphy. The Moon Diver mission concept proposes to send an extreme terrain rover into one of these pits, rappelling down the wall to expose the history of the lunar mare, and to illuminate the workings of the flood basalt eruptions that created them: eruptions on a scale never before witnessed in the history of humankind. This seminar will describe the science behind Moon Diver's goals, explain some of the engineering challenges that must be overcome to make it possible, and provide a window into how NASA mission concepts are developed from idea to reality. CAVING IN THE NEWS

Prehistoric Cave Paintings in Spain Show
Neanderthals Were Artists: Red ochre pigments were
discovered on stalagmites in the Caves of Ardales, near
Malaga in southern Spain. These cave paintings were
created by Neanderthals about 65,000 years ago. Modern
humans did not exist at the time these images were made
and the paintings indicate that Neanderthals may not
have been the unsophisticated relatives of Homosapiens
they have long been portrayed as. (article)
