| CAVING IN THE NEWS Cave Discovered on Moon Could be Home for Humans: Scientists have discovered a cave on the Moon. It's at least 100m deep and could be an ideal place for humans to build a permanent base. Helen Sharman, a British astronaut, told BBC News that the newly-discovered cave looked like a good place for a base, and suggested humans could potentially be living in lunar pits in 20-30 years. But, due to the depth of the cave, astronauts might need to rappel in and use "jet packs or a lift" to get out. While the cave could serve as a living space for humans, scientists also state it could help answer fundamental questions about the history of the Moon and our solar system.
