SCCI NEWS AND UPDATES

The Georgia-Alabama Land Trust announced a partnership with the Southeastern Cave Conservancy earlier this month that will create the Charles B. Henson Cave Preserve at Rising Fawn (*details*). Though there is no single cave that stands out in the preserve, there are 34 caves in the area where "you can have a great day".



The land is about 35 minutes from downtown Chattanooga along Newsome Gap Road in an area known as Johnson's Crook, where remnants of the would-be real estate development are still standing in the bluffs of the Lookout Mountain Ridge.

For the past 24 years, SCCi has worked to ensure the preservation of caves throughout the Southeast and currently manages more than 140 caves on 30 preserves.

NSS CORNER

White Nose Syndrome

Since many of us are returning from a White Nose Syndrome (WNS) infected area, we need to be aware that we may be carrying the WNS fungus on our gear and cave clothes. White-nose syndrome is a disease caused by the fungus Pseudogymnoascus destructans, that affects hibernating bats. The disease is currently in 26 states and the fungus has been found in three more. Seven bat species have been confirmed with WNS, and the fungus has been found on five more.



We should decon our gear before and between caves, as bats are very important to our crops and help control insect populations. Here is <u>good basic guide</u> to gear decon.

Danger Cave To Open For Rare Tour (article)

Utah state parks officials are preparing to host a rare tour of a remote west desert cave that holds evidence of human habitation dating back more than 11,000 years.
