## CAVING IN THE NEWS

Teen Builds His Own Underground Cave in Backyard After Dispute With Parents: Six years ago a teen from Alicante, Spain began to dig a hole in his backyard after an argument with his parents. He continued to dig and overtime, his hole has turned into an underground cave with a living room and bedroom. (article)

15 French Volunteers Leave Cave After 40 Days Without Daylight or Clocks: A group of fifteen people spent forty days living in and exploring Lombrives cave as part of a project called Deep Time. During their time in the cave, there was no natural light, the temperature was 50 degrees fahrenheit and the relative humidity was 100%. They had no access to clocks, no contact with the outside world, no updates on the pandemic nor any communications with friends or family. In partnership with laboratories in France and Switzerland, scientists monitored the 15 team members' sleep patterns, social interactions and behavioural reactions via sensors. (article)
