The Story Behind The Famous Yellow Bat Sticker:

Many of us have the famous yellow bat sticker on our cars or caving equipment, but do you know the story behind the sticker? It was originally designed by Earl "Biff" Biffle for the Middle Mississippi Valley Grotto; the design was rejected by the grotto and eventually adopted by the caving community as a secret ID to distinguish cavers from cave vandals. White Nose Syndrome: White-nose syndrome (WNS) is a disease caused by the fungus *Pseudogymnoascus destructans*, that affects hibernating bats. Many of us went to TAG in October. With RCG resuming cave trips in Florida next month, it's important to make sure our caving gear is decontaminated so WNS does not spread to Florida.
